

Reflection:

In the Creed we announce that we believe that the Church is One, Holy, Catholic and Apostolic. Today we celebrate the apostolic nature of the Church. Today is Mission Sunday, the day the Church sets aside to remind us of that. Being apostolic means that the whole Church and each baptized person has a duty to spread the Good News of the Gospel of Jesus Christ. Every Christian is bound to have zeal for souls bearing in mind that in the Church the supreme law must always be the salvation of souls. Everything we do must serve that purpose.

The Catechism has this to say about the apostolic mission of the Church: "The whole Church is apostolic, in that she remains, through the successors of St. Peter and the other apostles, in communion of faith and life with her origin: and in that she is "sent out" into the whole world. All members of the Church share in this mission, though in various ways. "The Christian vocation is, of its nature, a vocation to the apostolate as well." Indeed, we call an apostolate "every activity of the Mystical Body" that aims "to spread the Kingdom of Christ over all the earth." (863)

The selfsame word mission comes from the Latin verb mittere; to send. The first one to be sent was Jesus himself. He was sent by the Father and in imitation of him we are sent
